Year 10 End of Year Art Exam (4 hours)

DURING THE EXAM, YOU WILL CREATE AN A3-SIZED PAINTING, DEVELOPED FROM YOUR CURRENT COURSEWORK UNIT & IDEAS

- Whatever you make will be included as part of your final GCSE coursework portfolio.
- You MUST work from direct observation (looking at real objects in front of you) or YOUR OWN photos.
 No secondary sources allowed.

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PREPARATION

Before the exam, score marks for A01, A02 and A03 by completing an A3 Planning Sheet showing your best skills and ideas for the exam piece (see examples, right).

INCLUDE:

Photography: At least 6-12 new photos, TAKEN BY YOU, to help develop your ideas and composition.


Ideas: Make 4 drawings exploring compositional ideas for your examination piece. Based on your photos or observational drawings. These should be more detailed and refined than just rough sketches!

Written notes: use any spaces to add notes, bullet points and information to explain your ideas and thoughts. Always think about WWW and EBI when writing about your own work.

Artist influence: Show clearly (using words and images) how you have linked your work with at least one other artist.

Media/materials: make sure you include evidence of exploring paint, colour, texture, brushmarks, tone, line, pattern etc.

Detailed Plan: At least one in-depth plan for your painting – this needs to be a rehearsal for your colour, use of materials, tone etc.



GCSE Assessment Criteria (25% each)

A01: Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources

A02: Refine work by exploring ideas, using appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes

A03: Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses

A04: Present a personal and meaningful outcome that realizes intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language
