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Drama

Cambridge IGCSE (Course Code: 0411)

Description

The Drama IGCSE programme provides students with opportunities to explore the world of drama and theatre in a full and holistic manner. During the course, students take on the roles of performer, creator, designer and director. They have opportunities to develop practical skills in performance, both as an individual and within a group, while also examining the artistic choices made by actors, directors and designers in presenting performances for an audience. They will learn about a range of theatrical styles, genres and theorists.

The programme acts as an excellent springboard for further study in drama, theatre and the performing arts. However, it also enables students to develop a range of transferable skills. These include presentation skills, collaboration, creativity, time management and self-reflection. It is a practical, creative course that is suitable for many future pathways.

Assessment Breakdown

Component 1	Written Examination	Candidates are asked to answer questions on two elements: Script: two extracts from different plays set by the exam board. Devised work: either their practical devised coursework, or a piece of comparable quality.	
		The questions on the examination paper require candidates to have engaged with the material from the perspectives of creator, performer, director and designer. Students answer a range of questions based on the plays and the devised work they have created.	
		This component is externally assessed.	
Component 2	Practical Coursework	Candidates submit three pieces of practical work: one individual piece, based on an extract from a play (scripted), and two group pieces, one of which is an extract from a play (scripted) and one which is an original devised piece.	60%
		The practical coursework is assessed internally and then moderated externally. The group scripted piece is completed during the Trinity Term of Year 10, while the individual peace and the group devised pieces are completed during the Michaelmas Term of Year 11.
